# 1 HZ EXPLORE PERSONAL DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME

At HZ, every Bachelor's and Associate Degree student is given HZ Explore elective space, where you work on your personal development through meeting people and building connections. Within the Bachelor's programmes, this accounts for 5 credits, and within the Associate Degree programmes, it accounts for 2.5 credits. You are responsible for checking how many credits you need to earn per academic year through HZ Explore; you can find this in the implementation regulations for your programme on the HZ website: [HZ Education and Examination Regulations · HZ](#).

Personal development involves developing your own identity, promoting your own well-being and working on new skills. Through this, you discover your talents and interests, and who you are and/or wish to be as a person in relation to yourself, others and the wider world.

By taking part in HZ Explore, you'll develop personal skills that will help you further – during your studies, on work placements and later in your career. The activities within HZ Explore are designed to help you meet people outside your own bubble – students from other disciplines, with different backgrounds and perspectives. Sometimes you'll recognise yourself in them; sometimes they'll challenge you. But in any case, these encounters will change the way you look at the world, at others, and at yourself.

By 'personal skills', we mean both interpersonal and intrapersonal skills. Interpersonal skills enable you to interact and communicate with other people and cultures. Intrapersonal skills focus on self-awareness and self-regulation, and influence your ability to take responsibility and adapt to new circumstances.

Personal skills form the basis of global citizenship. Strong interpersonal and intrapersonal skills are essential for actively contributing to society, both within and beyond national borders.

'A global citizen is open to and curious about diversity, embraces different worldviews, participates in society, believes in the value of cooperation and the active upholding of a democratic constitutional state. This outlook extends beyond the boundaries of one's own country and culture. Global citizens feel connected to the whole world and to all of humanity.'<sup>1</sup>

The Inner Development Goals<sup>2</sup> are an international framework focused on self-development aimed at a sustainable future. These have therefore been taken as the basis for the learning objectives that are central to HZ Explore (see Chapter 3).

## 1.1 IMPLEMENTING AT HZ EXPLORE

To fill the HZ Explore elective space, HZ offers 44 activities worth 1.25 or 2.5 credits throughout the academic year. In all these activities, you will work on your personal development. Some activities are offered once a year, whilst others are offered twice a year. If you are a full-time student, you choose the activities you would like to take part in, in line with the number of credits you need to for HZ Explore (5 credits for a Bachelor's degree and 2.5 credits for an AD). For the range of activities on offer, see section 1.1.1, chapter 3; from 25 August 2026, you will also be able to find this information on the website.

If you are studying **part-time**, the structure of the HZ Explore component is organised slightly differently from that of the full-time programme. There are two formats, and you can check in the table below or with your lecturer to see which one applies to your degree programme:

1. Within your degree programme, some of the learning objectives from the HZ Explore breakdown (see Chapter 3) have been incorporated by your lecturers into the complex learning outcomes you are following. For bachelor's programmes, this involves four learning objectives, and for AD programmes, two learning objectives. You demonstrate these learning outcomes from your own programme, in consultation with your lecturer, through learning activities of your own choosing. You may make use of the range of 44 activities on offer, but you are also free to choose learning activities that suit your individual (work) situation.
2. Within your programme, HZ Explore is included as a separate course and is therefore not integrated into the core learning outcomes of your programme. In this case, as a student, you may choose a number of learning objectives yourself from the HZ Explore breakdown (see Chapter 3). For Bachelor's programmes, this involves four learning objectives, and for AD programmes, two learning objectives. You demonstrate these learning outcomes in consultation with your lecturer through learning activities of your own choosing. You may make use of the range of 44 activities on offer, but you are also free to choose learning activities that suit your individual (work) situation.

## 1.2 RANGE OF HZ ACTIVITIES

All 44 activities are linked to two learning objectives from the HZ Explore breakdown, which is based on the Inner Development Goals (see Chapter 3). The activities all offer opportunities for personal development, and we have subsequently divided them into seven categories:

### **Vitality & Well-being:** *Invest in yourself – body and mind*

These activities help you find a healthy balance between your studies, sport and relaxation. You'll work on your physical fitness, learn to cope with stress and pressure to perform, and discover how to develop a sustainable,

energetic lifestyle. Whether you want to exercise in a relaxed atmosphere, boost your resilience, or simply learn to look after yourself better – here you'll find practical tools and a supportive community.

#### **Sustainability & Environment** *Make a difference for our planet*

Become part of the sustainability movement! These activities combine your passion for the environment with practical action. You can make your voice heard in the Scheldt Youth Parliament (Schelde Jongerenparlement), gain hands-on experience in nature conservation, or discover how waste can be turned into valuable products. Perfect for students who do not only want to learn about sustainability, but also want to get actively involved.

#### **Intercultural sensitivity** *Discover the world and yourself*

Broaden your horizons and develop your intercultural skills by connecting with fellow students from different cultures. Whether you want to discover the culture of Zeeland as an international student, learn about other countries through film and literature, or simply improve your English – these activities will help you become a true global citizen with respect for diversity.

#### **Creativity & Innovation** *Let your imagination run wild*

Here you can discover and develop your creative side, whatever your field of study. From prototyping and design thinking to artistic workshops and experimental cooking – these activities encourage you to think out-of-the-box. You'll learn new skills, work with your hands and perhaps even discover a new passion that will shape your future career.

#### **Culture & Heritage** *Discover the richness of art and history*

Immerse yourself in the cultural world around you. These activities bring you into contact with architecture, theatre, music and other art forms. You'll not only develop cultural knowledge, but also a deeper understanding of the world around you. Ideal for students who want to broaden their cultural horizons and discover new forms of expression.

#### **Social Impact** *Work towards a better society*

For students who want to make the world around them a better place. These activities give you the chance to turn your social commitment into concrete action. Whether you want to hone your debating skills, contribute to the Sustainable Development Goals or organise charity events – here you'll learn how to bring about positive change.

#### **Professional Development:** *Build your future*

Invest in yourself and your career with practical skills you can apply straight away. From optimising your LinkedIn profile to developing interview skills and discovering your own talents – these activities will help you lay a strong foundation for your professional future. You'll also learn how to build meaningful relationships and take control of your own career.

### **1.3 REQUIREMENTS FOR PARTICIPATION IN HZ EXPLORE**

In the 26/27 academic year, there are no conditions for taking part in HZ Explore and/or participating in the 44 activities offered by HZ Explore. All activities are open to all students.

However, there is a maximum number of places per activity. This number varies by activity, and registration closes once an activity is full. Only for activities involving marketing a maximum number of places have been set per degree programme, as these activities focus on promotional tasks specific to each programme.

## 1.4 ACTIVITY COSTS

As HZ is keen to offer an accessible programme, there are enough free activities available to all students. In addition, there are four supplementary activities which, in some cases, involve costs, such as for a certificate of good conduct or for the purchase of materials required to carry out the activity. You may choose to take part in these activities on a voluntary basis. For these activities, see the tables (Chapter 4) for an explanation at the bottom of the subject entry, which provides a brief description of the course content.

## 2 PROCESS: HZ EXPLORE

Good information is important when making your choice. If necessary, you can receive guidance from your study coach. In this chapter, we explain the process, distinguishing between full-time and part-time students.

### 2.1 MAKING A CHOICE

#### Full-time students

The key information about the HZ Explore programme can be found in this document and on the HZ website [www.explore.hz.nl](http://www.explore.hz.nl). The HZ Explore webpage will go live on 25 August 2026, where you will be able to find all 44 activities.

Naturally, you'll want to find out about the various options available to you. You can do this in the following ways:

1. You can browse the HZ Explore webpage from 25 August 2026 or read through this guide. Both the webpage and the website feature the full range of activities and information on the registration procedures. You can also find contact details for lecturers, in case you have specific questions about a particular activity.
2. Attend a HZ Explore kick-off information session immediately after the summer break. You will receive an invitation for this, and it will be scheduled in your timetable. Here, you will receive information and have the opportunity to ask any questions you may have.
3. Reflect on your development and consider how you want to shape your personal development. What challenge do you want to take on?
4. Talk to your fellow students and, if necessary, your study career coach to see which activities suit your learning needs.

Please also read the information sent to you by email regarding registration periods and deadlines carefully so that you can organise your registration in good time.

#### Part-time students

For part-time students, it is important to check (with your lecturer(s)) which form of HZ Explore applies to your degree programme. The two options are described in section 1.1.2. In both cases, you should decide whether you wish to take part in the range of activities offered by HZ or would prefer to determine your own learning activities. If you would like to take part in the activities on offer, follow the orientation steps described above for full-time students. If you prefer to choose your own learning activities, follow these steps:

- Enrol in the study pathway-independent courses at the times and for the scope specified in the Study Regulations (IR) for your degree programme. AD students should enrol on HZX0045; Bachelor's students should enrol on HZX0045 and HZX0046 at the appropriate times. See also Chapter 4: Study Pathway-Independent Route.
- Go through the breakdown of HZ Explore (Chapter 3) and identify which learning objectives suit your personal development needs;
- Choose four learning objectives if you are on a four-year Bachelor's programme; choose two learning objectives if you are on an AD programme.
- Write down your proposal for how you intend to demonstrate these learning objectives on one A4 sheet and submit it to the HZ Explore tutor for your programme/domain for approval.



## 2.2 REGISTRATION AND ENROLMENT

Registration is only relevant for students who take part in the range of HZ activities, and does not apply to part-time students who demonstrate learning objectives independently of their study pathway.

- **Enrolment is open from 7 September to 13 September 2026. You enrol for the entire academic year, not on a semester-by-semester basis.**
  - Example: If your degree programme has allocated 2.5 credits for the 26/27 academic year, you can choose either two activities worth 1.25 credits each or one activity worth 2.5 credits.
- Visit the HZ Explore webpage (live from 25 August 2026);
- Find the activity or activities you'd like to take this academic year;
- 1. Where possible, undertake one activity per block or semester. If you undertake several activities side by side, this can cause problems with meetings that have to be attended at the same time and this can affect the extent to which you can successfully complete the activity(s);
- Click on the activity or activities and scroll down until the registration button appears;
- Click on the registration button and follow the steps to enrol in Osiris. **Places are limited.**

## 2.3 RETAKES

HZ Explore will launch in the 2026–2027 academic year. As usual, you can sit each assessment twice (two assessment attempts). If you have not passed either assessment attempt in that academic year, you will have two options in the following academic year:

You can sit the same test once or twice more. Whether you need to repeat the activity will depend on the test format and the feedback you received on your previous test results. If you are unsure about this, please contact the examiner for advice.

You can choose a different HZ Explore activity and sit the corresponding assessment (one or both assessment opportunities).

## 2.4 SUBMITTING AND FINALISING RESULTS

After completing an **HZ activity**, the examiner will enter and confirm your result in Osiris.

After completing **learning activities that are independent of your study pathway**, you will compile a portfolio demonstrating that you have achieved your chosen learning objectives. You must submit this portfolio to the lecturer who supervises the HZ Explore route within your programme/domain. The result will be entered and confirmed by the examiner in Osiris.

The result is assessed as 'pass' or 'fail'. You will therefore not receive a mark.

## 4 RANGE OF ACTIVITIES AT HZ

The activities are organised by category. Each activity is linked to two HZ Explore learning objectives, which are ultimately assessed. The activities are worth either 1.25 or 2.5 credits in total and are offered alternately in semester 1 and/or semester 2. Each activity is assessed in an appropriate manner, and these assessments are also included in the tables.

Although the language of instruction is not always English (some activities are only in Dutch), all activities are listed below with an English explanation. Please be mindful of the box in the right upper corner to check the language of instruction.
